Overview of Delta 8

Delta-8 THC is a psychoactive substance found in the *Cannabis sativa* plant, of which marijuana and hemp are two varieties.

When we traditionally are thinking of marijuana/cannabis, the psychoactive substance in that is Delta-8 THC.

Delta 8 is a naturally occurring compound in the cannabis sativa plant but the plan contains only trace amounts of Delta 8. Because of this, delta-8 goes through a manufacturing process to make it highly concentrated and capable of producing a high.

How is Delta 8 legal?

- The 2018 Farm Bill made it legal to farm hemp containing no more than 0.3% THC
- As a result, CBD and other cannabinoid derivatives were effectively legalized through legal loopholes
- Previously, federal law did not differentiate between hemp and other cannabis plants containing THC - this effectively made hemp

There are many challenges related to Delta 8:

- Little research has been conducted on the substance
- There is little regulation for manufacturers and retailers
- Policy and legislation have not caught up to Delta 8

Policy at a private institution (Creighton University):
